FUNDAMENTALS OF THOUGHT

Academic Integrity and Plagiarism is a subject that is on the agenda amongst academic fraternity. Universities are thinking about how to ensure Academic Integrity and the kind of issues they face in order to achieve this. It covers the standards of honesty and trust involved in scholarship of the discipline and the conventions used to acknowledge the source of ideas and data. Induction is a useful place to tell researchers about academic integrity and plagiarism but ongoing academic development is usually how researchers' best came to understand and use the disciplinary conventions. If plagiarism is discovered, it not only makes the researcher concerned liable to serious penalties, but raises questions about personal integrity. However, sometimes what appears to be intentional plagiarism can be the result of failing to follow standard methods of acknowledging the source of words, ideas and diagrams in work. Therefore, the Institute of Research and Community Services of Bandung Institute of Technology supported by iGroup, organizes and invites all students, researchers, and lecturers to a workshop of academic writing with theme "Turnitin: Supporting Plagiarism Policy."
